

Independent Study Program

- The Independent Study Program (ISP) provides homeschooling options to parents.
- The ISP was a part of the Whisman School District prior to the merger of the Mountain View and Whisman School Districts.
- Currently, MVWSD is the only District in the area that offers an ISP.

- Parents choose ISP option because they are planning to homeschool for only a year or two, or are planning to homeschool only one of their children while keeping the others registered in public school.
- Currently, the MVWSD ISP has 12 students enrolled.
- Out of these 12 students, 4 are siblings.

- When parents register their students in the ISP, technically the student is still considered in public school.
- Parents serve as teacher's aide as students are assigned a credentialed hourly teacher
- Parents are required to keep the records.
- The curriculum is aligned with the California State
 Standards and testing is required

Current State of MVWD Independent Student Programs

- Home School Programs no longer require oversight by school districts.
- Our ISP uses facilities space and requires administration oversight.
- Not aligned to our Strategic Plan 2021
- Home School options have evolved for parents
 - California HomeSchool Network
 - <u>California Virtual Academy</u>
 - The Home School Association of California

- Costs for 2016-2017
 - Field Trip Costs: \$ 10,571.00
 - Curriculum Costs: \$5,438.00
- Current Costs for 2017-2018: \$4,996.00
- These funds can be used for other initiatives
