During the 2017-18 school year, the MVWSD Board of Trustees instructed staff to initiate planning to ensure the successful opening of the new N. Whisman School for the 2019-20 school year.

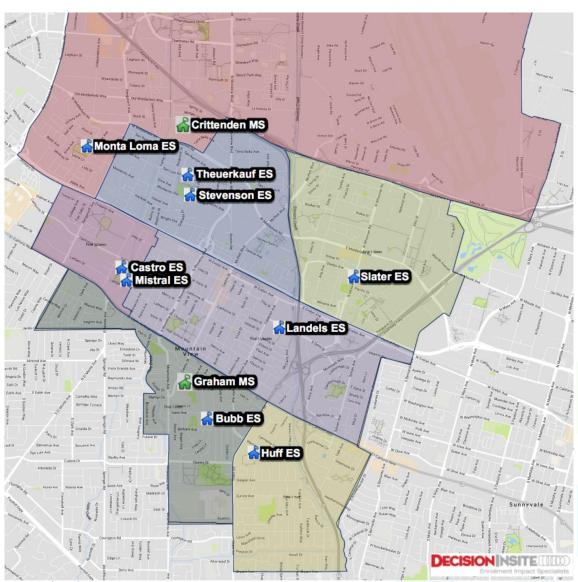

Current Board Policy

- 26 priorities that guide enrollment
- Staff and community feedback is that the priorities are complicated and conflict with Board direction
- Neighborhood schools is the direction
 - Priority for students currently enrolled at a particular school in the District:
 - First priority to students who reside in the District and were enrolled at the same school during the prior school year.



Current reality

Current boundaries

- The 2019-20 school boundaries support Board direction to create contiguous elementary school boundaries
- Our current enrollment priorities support more of a choice model
- Several sites are at capacity, which necessitates the need to implement new boundaries

Additional costs incurred for Slater

- Certificate of Participation \$2.6 million
- Operating costs to staff site \$646,000
- Cost of rental portables at Huff, Bubb and Landels – \$9,000 x 25 = \$225,000 per year

Things to consider

- Open enrollment does not support neighborhood schools
- Schools are reaching capacity
 - Huff is currently at max capacity 625
- Portables cannot be removed until new boundaries are fully implemented
- Feedback should not come in the form of a straw poll
- Grandfathering = additional costs



EPTF Guidance Draft Recommendations

March 15, 2018

Structure of EPTF

- The EPTF has a member from every elementary attendance zone, choice school and middle school.
- Staff from each site, as well as the District Office, are also participating members.
- There are two working groups in the EPTF.

Feedback collection and themes

Met with DAC, DELAC and Focus Groups

- Concern about grandfathering exists across all groups (mixed emotions)
- With so many requests not everyone is going to be happy
- Both recommendations have positives and negatives
 - In some cases it was suggested to create a new Administrative Regulation that is an amalgamation of both.
- This isn't being sprung on people 3.5 years and counting

Recommendation A

- Similar format to our current process.
 - Sets priorities for students based on a set of criteria
 - Similar weighting system that looks at whether a student has siblings, attended the school the year prior, or is an employee
 - Allows for intradistrict transfers
- Choice Schools
 - Similar lottery process with more weight given to siblings
- Grandfather No grandfathering

Feedback on A

- Concern that there is no grandfathering recommendation
- Feels like it is business as usual
- Allows for people to leave their home school for a variety of reasons
- Is there enough space at impacted sites if this continues
- Should choice schools be subject to the same guidelines

Recommendation B

- Only students within the attendance boundary can attend; exception is given for children of staff
- Choice schools
 - Would like to develop more diversity in choice schools
 - Boundaries or by using free and reduced lunch
 - Parents must attend a Kinder interest night
- Grandfathering
 - only 5th graders can elect to stay

Feedback on Option B

- Like the approach to diversify choice schools;
 specifically Stevenson Elementary
- Feeling that all kids going to their home school is unrealistic
- Some appreciation for the grandfathering option of grade 5, while at the same time some want it to go lower
- Concern that neighborhoods zones will need to be redrawn at some point in time

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
