Solution 1: Strategic review and analysis of Response to Instruction (RTI) programming effectiveness at 8 district elementary (K-8) schools

Objectives

- Provide a comprehensive review of the allocation of programs and services in the defined schools
- Evaluate how resources, programs and supports align with district priorities & student performance
- Evaluate the efficiency and effectiveness of the resources and determine the adequacy of identification of students under these programs
- Provide recommendations for modifications in programming, organizational structure, and integration of programs and services (including digital)

Deliverable(s)

- 1. Comprehensive Review of District MTSS/RTI Strategy & Implementation
 - a. Review district records which illustrate the structures, policies, practices, and outcomes of RTI services. The review will include but not limited to:
 - i. Organizational structure and school staffing models
 - ii. Policy and procedure documents pertaining to priority group students (include special education students) services, co-teaching models, curriculum development and assessment, instructional and assistive technology
 - iii. Student performance data (2 years data)
 - iv. State and internal benchmark assessment data for all students (2 years data)
 - v. Support services and curricular/intervention program data and information as provided by the district and school (up to 2 or 3 programs)
 - vi. School staffing & intervention schedules
 - vii. Student identification process for students to obtain specific interventions
 - viii. After-school programs targeting tier 2 and tier 3 students
 - b. Interviews and survey with District staff and key stakeholders to identify perceptions for improvement. Participants will include representatives from the following groups:
 - i. District central office administrators and Department staff
 - ii. School administrators, teachers, assistants, and itinerant staff
- 2. Data Analysis and Strategic Support
 - a. Performance analysis of publicly available data and local benchmark data as provided by the district for all schools to support the work to be reviewed under MTSS/RTI review for the last 2 academic years.
 - b. Leadership session to share findings and provide key insights and recommendations
 - c. Document the methodology used for analysis of school performance
 - d. Provide all associated excel documents with detailed analysis and methodology

- 3. Summary presentation with accountability metrics, insights, and recommendations
 - a. Focused analysis and recommendations including:
 - i. Findings from the review will be analyzed to identify successes in RTI programs and services, as well as identify root causes of barriers or inefficiencies to student success
 - ii. The District's implementation of instruction and services will be reviewed to understand the process of identification and process of providing targeted instruction
 - iii. An investigation into the effectiveness of current, tiered intervention programs in use and whether the specially designed instruction is matched to the skill deficits, as well as the effectiveness of monitoring student progress
 - iv. Investigate alignment of resources and efficiency of use of resources in each school with regard to RTI
 - b. A detailed summary deck will be provided with findings and summaries of observations addressing the objectives of the review
 - i. The draft report will be submitted to the District for comment
 - ii. We will work with the District to ensure clarity and to resolve any areas of concern, before producing the final summary presentation
 - iii. At the request of the District, we will meet with any group(s) or individuals to present the summary and discuss the recommendations

- 1. Student assessment data at the student level
- 2. Membership data for all schools by grade
- 3. Demographic information by grade
- 4. Additional data as per the requirement of the study

- 6. Data Confidentiality the district and Atlantic will sign the confidentiality agreement in compliance with FERPA
