 - Program Review Instrument
 - Desired Results Parent Survey
 - Age Appropriate Environment Rating Scales (ERS)
 - Desired Results Developmental Profile and DRDP tech reports

State Preschool Self-Evaluation Process

- Self-evaluation occurs throughout the school year.
- Data from all resources are compiled into a narrative.
- Strengths and areas of growth are identified.
- Areas of growth lead to an action plan.

- Continued efforts to improve in our lowest scoring area of the Environmental Rating Scale – Personal Care Routines
- Continued efforts to improve our outdoor play environments
