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Purpose of CAASPP Assessment

Purpose of CAASPP Assessments

- CAASPP Assessments help the district monitoring progress towards goals
- Provides educators with feedback on whether educational goals were met
- As an end of year assessment, it allows students to show what they know and are able to do
- CAASPP data helps build accountability and design action steps for student instructional support and planning - guides site, district plans



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CAASPP Spring 2021 Assessment

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Assessment Administration

- **CAASPP** (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress - 3rd - 8th, 11th Grade)
- **CAST** (California Science Test - 5th, 8th, High school)
- **CAAS** (California Alternate Assessments - 3rd-8th, 11th Grade)
- Current District assessment window
 - April 19th - May 28th
 - Typically 4-5 weeks are assigned for assessment administration and make-ups
 - Schools start CAASPP the week after return from Spring Break
 - 1 week each assigned for ELA, Math, and Science

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2021 Assessment Administration

CAASPP for English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA) and Mathematics and the California Science Test can be administered:

- **In-person** (adhering to state, county, and local health and safety requirements)
or
- **Remote** (using monitoring tools on the Secure Browser app: camera, speakers, chat during test session)

New for 2021 - Adjusted Form (Shorter) Test

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Assessment Considerations

Assessment Considerations

- Currently, we are expected to test in the Spring
- USDOE (President Biden’s administration) announced on Feb 22nd, that states will not be allowed to cancel assessments for this year but will have flexibility on administration and accountability
- Recently, state elicited feedback from districts regarding CAASPP and ELPAC assessments.
- The survey asked Districts the following:
 - Preference on extending the ELPAC and CAASPP assessment windows
 - Stay the same, extend to July 30, 2021 or extend to Fall 2021
 - What local assessments do Districts use to measure student progress

Assessment Considerations

- The State Board of Education voted on Feb 24th to seek relief from certain federal testing, accountability, and reporting requirements.
- If granted, California's federal flexibility could include
 - decoupling accountability from the 2020-21 assessments
 - waiving the requirement that the Academic Achievement Indicator be adjusted to account for a participation rate below 95%,
 - extending test administration window to July 30th
 - waiving CAST (Science Test) altogether for 2021
- The Board directed the SBE and CDE staff to come back with a proposal for the USDOE that would allow Districts an alternative to CAASPP assessments by providing local data instead of administering statewide assessments.
- Assessment Flexibility at the March 17/18 State Board of Education Meeting

Assessment Considerations

- Many new features on the assessment platform (Secure Browser) will require additional training and time to practice
 - Students will have to be able to login to the secure browser on their own without teacher Zoom support
 - Students in grades 3 and 4 have never taken a CAASPP assessment
- Teachers will need to be trained and will need to train students on the new assessment platform and features including how to access the secure browser independently
- Students will need to practice the new features before taking the summative assessment
- Navigating multiple fronts will be tough on students, teachers, and parents
 - Safe campus return
 - Transition to hybrid learning
 - Learn new COVID safe school routines
 - Getting ready to take summative CAASPP assessment

Assessment Considerations

- With school reopening on the forefront, sites are focusing on getting students back safely and helping them have a smooth transition
- CAASPP assessment has always been a consideration when we have been planning for reopening
- With the adjusted shorter assessment, we may need less days for testing than previous years
- 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th graders also take the Math placement test in May
 - Need to balance instruction and assessments

Proposed Phased Reopening

Scenario 1

- Reopening will continue to occur in phases, as planned
- CAASPP assessment scheduled after all groups are back on campus

Group 1 - Prek, TK, K, 1st, 6th, SAI/SDC

Group 2 - 2nd, 3rd, 7th



(Two weeks)

Group 3 - 4th, 5th, 8th

Proposed Phased Reopening

Scenario 1 Pros

- No change in current reopening plan
- Teachers, staff, sites and families continue to prepare and plan to return

Cons

- Teachers will need to be trained to administer the test both remotely and in-person at the same time
- Group 3 students (grades 4, 5 and 8) will have only 1 week to adjust before they take the CAASPP assessment and 4th graders have never taken this assessment

Proposed Phased Reopening

Scenario 2

- Group set-up remains the same as proposed earlier
- Bring student groups back within a week of previous group
- CAASPP Assessment starts two weeks after last group back on campus

Scenario 2

Pros	Cons
<ul style="list-style-type: none">● All students on campus before testing starts● Group 3 students have 2+ weeks to adjust before taking CAASPP● Almost 2+ weeks for make-ups in scenario 2a● Students return on campus earlier● All groups get 2+ months on campus	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Sites will need to plan and prepare for different groups returning earlier and consecutively● Teachers will need to be trained to administer the test both remotely and in-person at the same time● Not a lot of leeway in the start dates between phases, in case a wrinkle comes up

Proposed Phased Reopening

Scenario 3

- Rework student groups
 - Bring all testing grades (3rd-8th) after CAASPP administration
 - Schedule testing earlier in the window (make-ups can be done when students back on campus)
 - One week between Group 2 and 3
- Group 1 - Prek, TK, K, 1st, 2nd, SAI/SDC

Proposed Phased Reopening

Scenario 3

Pros	Cons
<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Students, Teachers get CAASPP testing done before coming back ~ not as disruptive● Teachers only need to conduct remote testing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Will postpone return to school further for some groups● Will need to revisit entire group return● Multiple weeks (4-5 weeks) between Group 1 and next group coming back● Group 3 only gets 3 weeks on campus

Proposed Phased Reopening

Scenario 4

- Rework student groups but 2 weeks time between different groups returning
- Bring all testing grades (3rd-8th) before CAASPP administration

Group 3- Prek, TK, K, 1st

Proposed Scenario 4 Possible Timeline

 Groups have 2 weeks in between

Pros	Cons
<ul style="list-style-type: none">● All students get back on campus before testing starts● Testing Grades time to adjust before taking CAASPP assessment● Sites have time to plan for testing and support students' safe return to campus	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Will need to revisit entire group return● Younger students come in last and get 6 weeks on campus● Teachers will need to be trained for remote and in-person test administration
