# Goal 5 Resource Stewardship

- Goal 5: Students, staff and community members will have access to various resources, such as technology, facilities, furniture, equipment, etc., in a fiscally responsible manner, to fulfill the mission of MVWSD.

# Guiding Information

- Safety of students and staff
  - Feedback during the Master Facilities Planning process indicated that for safety reasons, public adult restrooms should not be shared with students.
  - Additionally, the restrooms provide convenience for city residents and will be easier to maintain cleanliness.

# Initial Collaboration with the City

- Collaboration around restroom standards with Parks and Recreation (sink, flooring, stalls).
- Initial discussion of placement and ease of cleaning and use by residents and Parks and Recreation.
- City and District will jointly communicate community meetings.

# Design Considerations

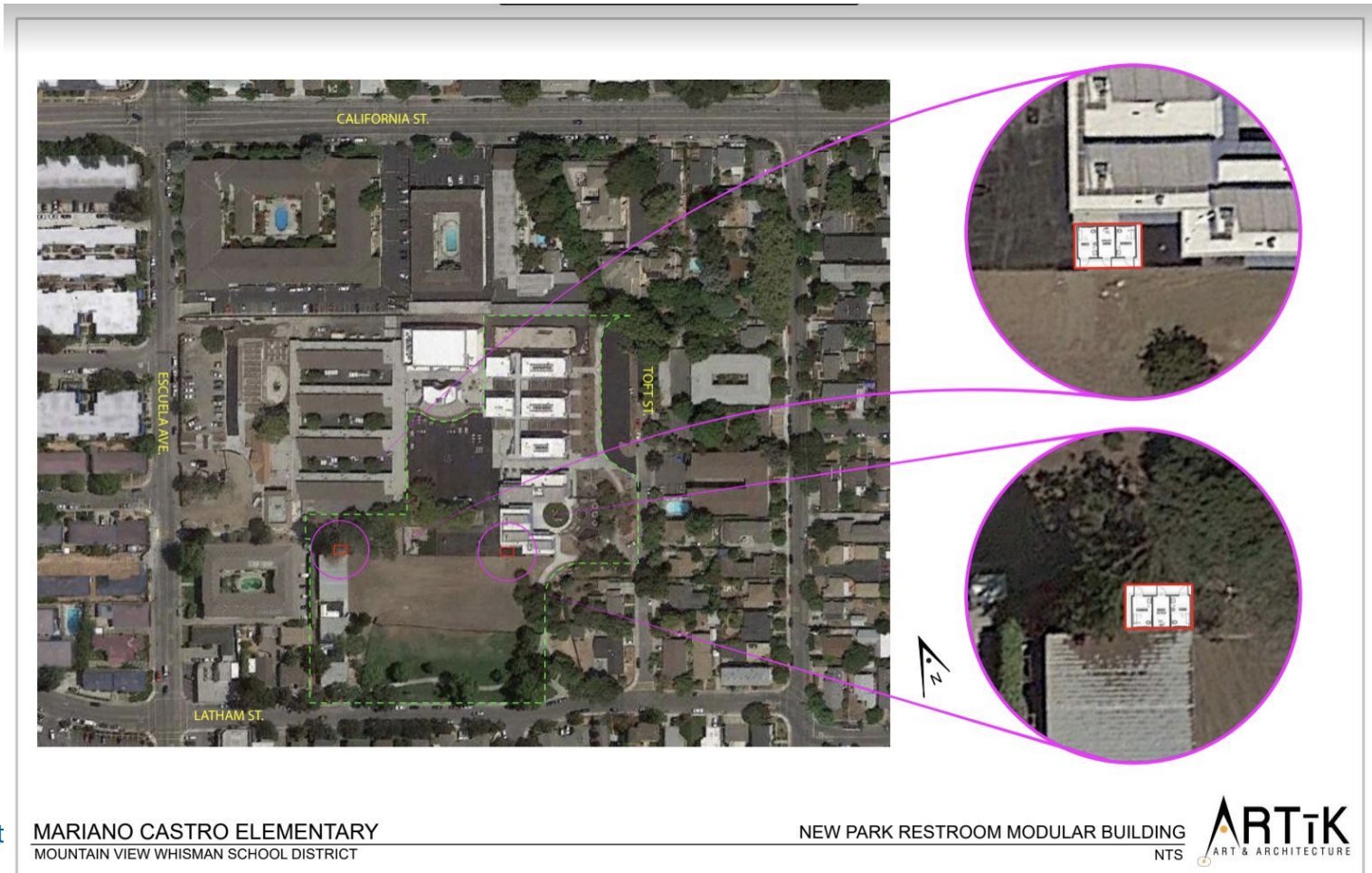
- Proximity to sewer and power lines

# Feedback From MVPD, City, and Principals

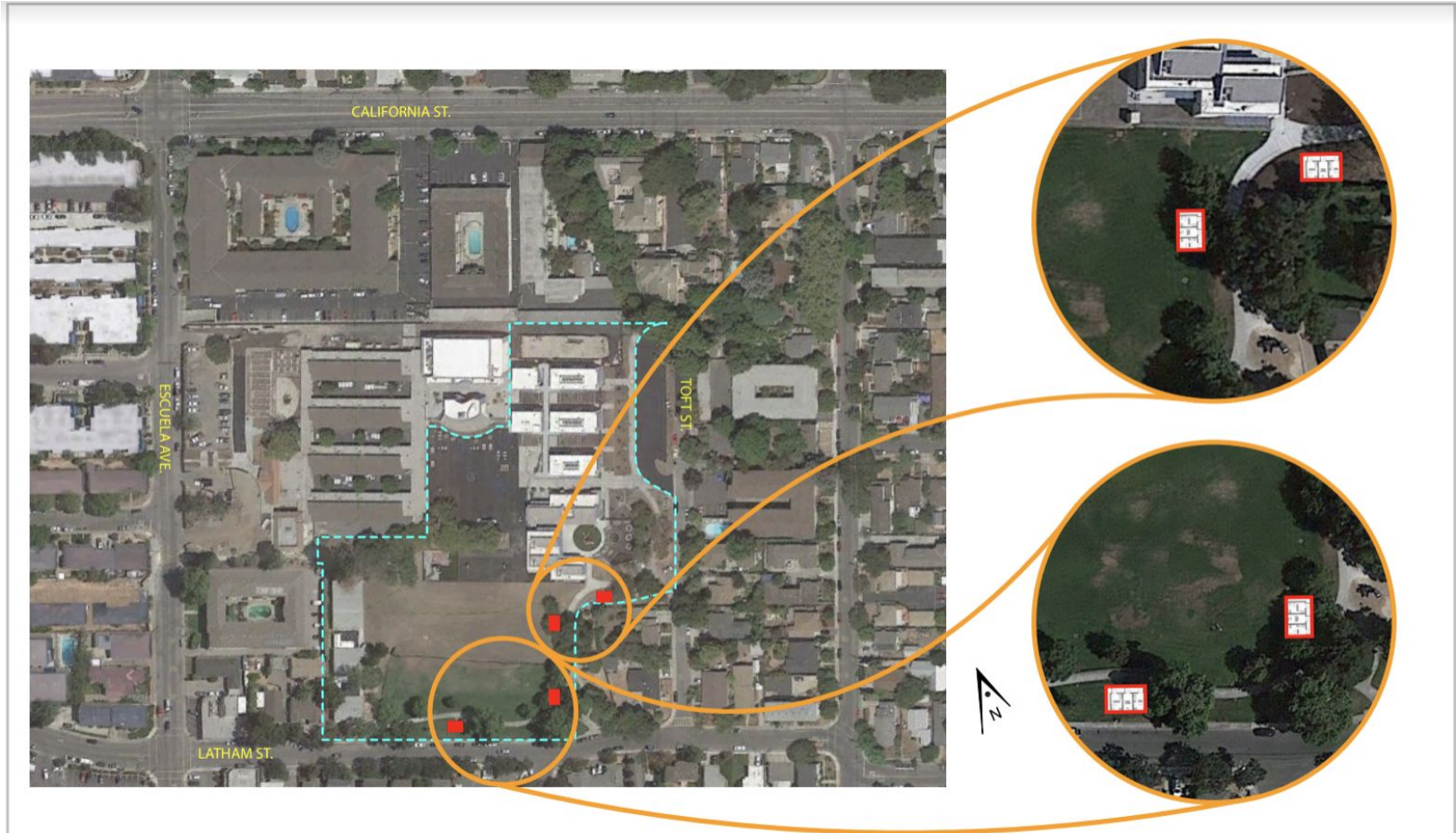
- The District received feedback from the City (Parks and Recreation) on locations for access to clean the restrooms and community usage.
  - District offered to present to City Council and Parks and Recreation.
- Principals gave feedback based on site usage.
- MVPD was consulted on possible locations and safety.
  - To date there have not been significant issues reported with public restrooms on campuses.

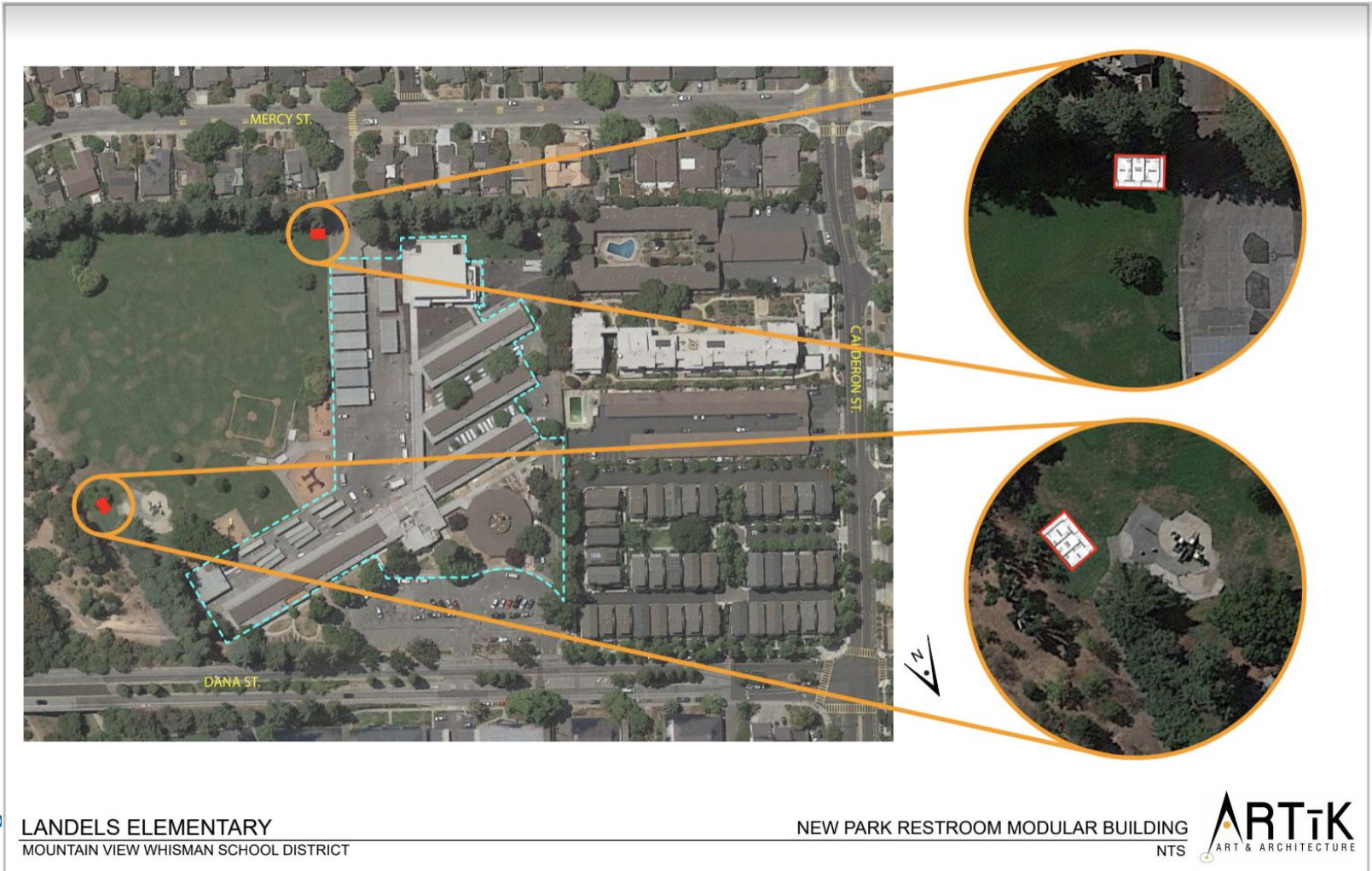

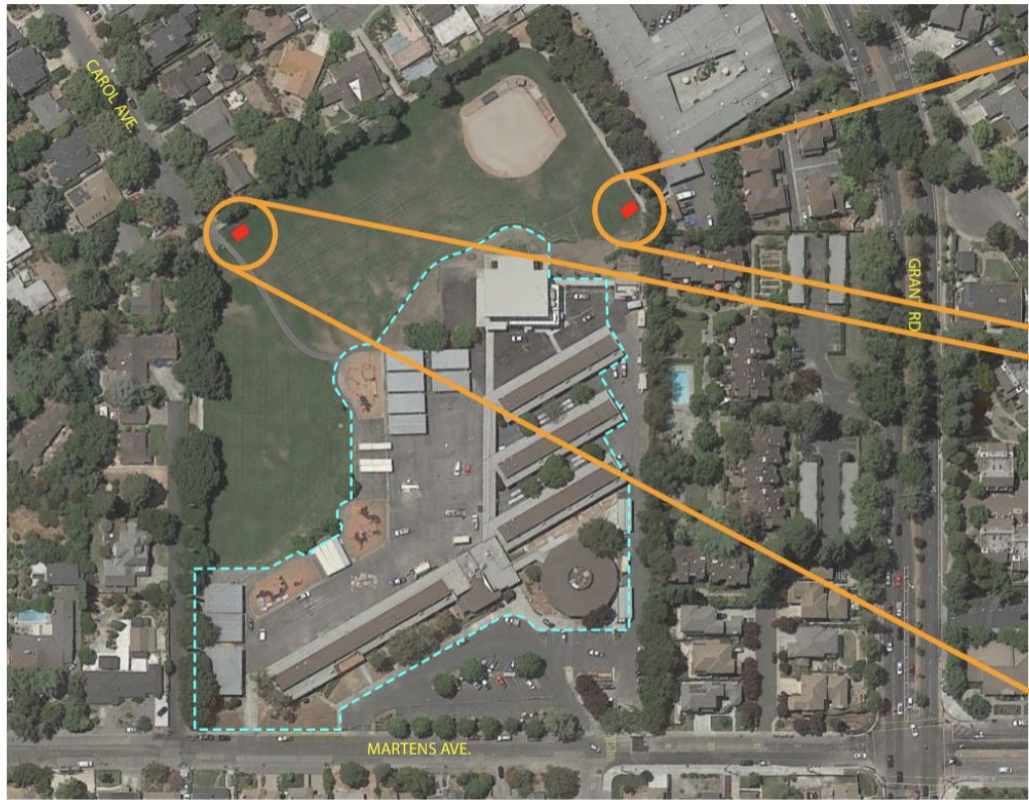
