Considerations

Considerations

- Maintain staffing ratios consistent with CBA
 - TK-3: 24:1
 - 4-5: 30:1
 - 6-8: 180 contacts/day or 33 in a class period
- Eliminate combination classes
 - Particularly important due to learning gap concerns
- Maintain consistency with Public Health protocols and cohort guidance
- Maintain fiscal prudence



Enrollment Projections

Spring 2021 Enrollment Confirmation:

An enrollment confirmation survey was sent to all families before Spring Break.

The survey requested that families confirm their enrollment in

- the Distance Learning School
- In-person at the neighborhood/choice school

As of noon April 23, requested enrollment was as follows:

Distance Learning School: 149

In-person at neighborhood/choice school: 2996

(Assuming in-person for families who don't reply)

This accounts for 3,145 of our current 4,707 students enrolled.

Exploring DLS Options

Distance Learning School Proposal - April 2021

This school will provide a learning experience specifically designed to meet the needs of students learning entirely from home for the full school year. Enrollment in the Distance Learning School includes:

- A student issued Chromebook for instructional use
- Live instruction from teachers 5 days/week
- The same core curriculum used at neighborhood schools (ELA, Math, Social Studies, Science)
- RTI (Response to Instruction)
- Physical Education classes via Zoom
- Art and Music classes through CSMA (elementary)
- Elective classes (middle school)
- ELD and Special Education services (if applicable)
- Other programs or activities as implemented by the school

Parameters

Below were the parameters discussed regarding 2021-22 options

- No simultaneous instruction (hybrid)
- Eliminate combination classes
 - Though there was discussion that this is preferred over hybrid instruction
- Students enrolled in choice programs who request distance learning will be enrolled in the Distance Learning School, but will retain their spot in the choice school for the upcoming year
- One opportunity, mid-year, for students to move from Distance Learning to In-Person instruction
- Students in the Distance Learning School will need to have similar instructional options to those in neighborhood schools (core classes, RTI, Electives, etc)

Considerations- Spring 2021

- When the Distance Learning School was initially proposed, there were 2,246 students who had indicated a desire to continue in distance learning in the 2021-22 school year.
- Enrollment at that level permits many programmatic options.
- 82 of the 149 families said they want DLS until children are vaccinated. This would reduce DLS enrollment by 55% mid year

Considerations - Spring 2021

- With an updated TK-8 enrollment of 149, programmatic options are limited
 - Combination classes would have been necessary
 - Multiple middle school math classes would not be able to be offered
 - All students in the grade would need to be enrolled in the same math pathway
 - If students had an option to return to in-person learning mid-year and enrollment declined even further, multiple grade levels would need to be combined to staff a class

Considerations - Spring 2021

 In April, Governor Newsom stated that schools should plan to conduct full-time, in-person instruction in the fall, in compliance with Cal/OSHA emergency temporary standards and public health guidelines.

Board Decision - April 2021

Based on many factors including, but not limited to the following:

- State guidance
- Limited enrollment
- Staffing challenges
- Financial prudence

the Board of Trustees voted not to open a Distance Learning / Virtual school for 2021-22



New State Guidance

Assembly Bill 130

AB 130 was approved by the Governor on July 9, 2021.

The trailer bill covered a variety of topics including new requirements for independent study

Short term Independent Study - adjusted to be available from 3-15 days (Previously 5-15 days)

Long term independent study (more than 15 days) - added for the 21-22 school year with additional requirements

 AB130 requires all districts to offer an Independent Study program to students whose health would be put at risk by in-person instruction, as determined by the parent or guardian, for the 2021-22 school year.

Long term independent study (more than 15 days) - added for the 21-22 school year with additional requirements

- Families will need to be notified of the Remote Independent Study offerings
- Participation in Remote Independent Study must be voluntary
- Documentation of participation and engagement in each day of Remote Independent Study is required
- Remote Independent Study agreements must be signed
- Students who wish to return to in person learning must be re-enrolled within 5 days

Re-Enrollment

- Enrollment in neighborhood schools fluctuates throughout the year
 - Students wishing to return to in person learning may be placed back at their neighborhood school if there is still space available
 - If there is no longer space, the student will be re-enrolled at another school with space available at the student's grade level
- Enrollment at Choice Schools does not fluctuate
 - Students returning could be placed back into the choice school or a site with available space

- Grades TK-3: Will include daily synchronous time for all students
- Grades 4-8: Will include both daily live & weekly synchronous
- Content must be aligned to grade level standards
- Instruction must be provided at a level of quality and intellectual challenge substantially equivalent to in-person instruction
- *Special Needs Students* cannot participate in independent study unless the IEP specifically allows for such participation

Attendance for students in Remote Independent Study must be maintained in a similar manner as last year

- Daily attendance monitoring
- Engagement and assignment completion
 - Must maintain written or computer-based evidence of student engagement, listing all assignments, assessments, and associated grades
- Re-Engagement plans will be required for students absent for 60% of the school days
- Board Policy for Independent Study must be updated and approved prior to the first day of school

LEA must maintain written or computer-based evidence of pupil engagement

- Must report in CALPADS the number of students participating in I.S. for 15 or more schooldays (new field will be added starting in 2021-22)
- Must report to CCEE on a biweekly basis the following:
 - # of students who have opted into independent study
 - How the LEA is meeting the daily or weekly synchronous requirement for students
 - Actions the LEA is taking to encourage the transition of students participating in I.S. to in-person instruction



Exploring Remote Independent Study Options

Options that were considered

- Option 1: Apply for a waiver
- Option 2: Run our own MVWSD Remote Independent Study Program
- Option 3: Contract with Santa Clara County Office of Education to provide Remote Independent Study Programming
- Option 4: Enter into Interdistrict Transfer agreements with another district offering I.S.
- Option 5: Contract with an outside company to provide programming

Option 1: Apply for a waiver from the Santa Clara County Office of Education

A waiver may be requested if:

- Offering independent study would create an unreasonable fiscal burden on the school district due to low numbers of pupils participating or other extenuating circumstances and
- 2. The governing board of the school district does not have the option to enter into an interdistrict transfer agreement with another school district or to contract with a county office of education to provide an I.S. option

Option 2: Run our own MVWSD Remote Independent Study Program

- Per discussions in Spring, staffing would be a challenge
 - Few teacher applicants may not be able to hire staff
- Program offerings (math pathways, electives, STEAM, etc) would be limited by the number of students enrolling
- Not financially feasible

Option 3: Contract with Santa Clara County Office of Education to provide Independent Study Programming

- The County Office does not have a K-5 program
- There is limited space in the current 6-8 program at the county
- Costly

Option 4: Enter into Interdistrict Transfer agreements with another district offering Independent Study

- Significant cost
- Students would have to disenroll from our district and re-enroll to return

Option 5: Contract with an outside company to provide programming

- Contracting with an online company:
 - More financially feasible than transfers
 - Programs are established no reinvention of material
 - Can offer similar grade level program offerings
 - Does not impact our in person staffing numbers
 - Programs are data rich (attendance, engagement, assignment completion, etc)



Recommendation

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends Option 5

- Contracting with Edgenuity
 - Online Independent Study program for students
 - Teachers provided through Edgenuity
 - Workbooks provided for elementary students
 - Middle School curriculum is fully online
 - Progress monitoring data available
 - Attendance, engagement, assignments and progress

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends Option 5

- Contracting with Edgenuity
 - Can enroll students in courses similar to in-person classes
 - 8 courses for middle school, including core and electives
 - Cost:
 - Staff training fee \$2500
 - \$1600 per student per semester (elementary)
 - \$2000 per student per semester (middle)



Planning

Planning for Remote Independent Study

- Provide information session to interested families
- Meet with families to register for I.S., review, and sign master agreements
- Provide devices to all students enrolling in I.S.
- Provide necessary materials
- Train staff member to monitor attendance and engagement data and support re-engagement strategies as needed



Guidance

Guidance from Board of Trustees

- Does the Board have an interest in maintaining enrollment spots at choice schools for I.S. students to return this year or next?
 - If so, we would freeze enrollment at the choice schools

 - Approved BP and AR are required prior to the first instructional day

Independent Study Enrollment Process

- Interested students and families should
 - Complete the Remote Independent Study request form
 - attend a Virtual Remote Independent Study Program information session
- Students and Families wishing to enroll in Remote Independent Study will complete an enrollment form and schedule a meeting to review and sign the Independent Study Master Agreement
 - Students must maintain residency within the MVWSD boundaries to be enrolled in the Remote Independent Study program
