Background

Background

- In response to the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19), the U.S. Congress passed American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act, which was signed into law on March 11, 2021.
- The ESSER III funding provides LEAs with emergency relief funds to address the impact of COVID-19 on elementary and secondary schools
- The ARP Act requires LEAs that receive ESSER III funds to complete a Safe Return to In-person Instruction and Continuity of Services plan as well as an Expenditure Plan.



Plan Requirements

Requirements for Funding

- Participate in Title I for 2021-22
- Apply for funding by submitting the ESSER III Legal Assurances by June 25, 2021
- Have a Safe Return to In-Person & Continuity of Services Plan
 - This plan is the District's Cal/OSHA Safety Plan with a new name
 - It must be revised and updated every six months
- Complete an Expenditure Plan for the use of ESSER III funds and submit to the District's county office of education on or before October 29, 2021

MVWSD's ESSER III estimated allocation is \$2,341,572

Required Contents

- How the LEA will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff
- How the LEA will ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address students' academic needs and students' and staff social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services.
- A description of the LEA's practice that provided the public with an opportunity to provide comment and feedback

Implications for MVWSD

Implications

- MVWSD posted its Cal/OSHA Safety Plan on February 22, 2021 and solicited input in the plan development
- This allows MVWSD to follow Option 2:
 - Assurances were signed on June 24, 2021
 - MVWSD has revised the CAL/OSHA plan to ensure compliance with the requirements of the Safe Return to In-Person & Continuity of Services
 - Revise every six months as applicable through September 2023



Safe Return to In Person Learning and Continuity of Services Plan Updates

Safe Return to In Person Learning Plan

The original plan written in January 2021 included the following elements:

- Identification and Evaluation of COVID-19 Hazards
- Employee screening
- Physical Distancing
- Face Coverings
- Engineering controls Partitions between office staff and public / testing dividers
- Cleaning and disinfecting
- Hand sanitizing


- Personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Investigating and Responding to COVID-19 Cases
- System for Communicating
- Training and Instruction
- Exclusion of COVID-19 Cases
- Reporting, Recordkeeping, and Access
- Return to Work Criteria

Safe Return to In-Person Learning Plan Updates

The revised plan has been updated to include:

- Stakeholder Engagement
- Links to documents on the MVWSD website including:
 - Quarantine infographics, on-site COVID testing information, and school site COVID safety plans
- Diagnostics and Screening
- Efforts to Provide Vaccination
- Ventilation
 - HVAC updates, Merv 13 filters, and Portable HEPA filters
- Respiratory Etiquette
- Accommodations for students with special needs, including:
 - Remote Independent Study
 - Short Term Independent study
 - Mental Health support services



Expenditure Plan

Expenditure Plan

Must submit an expenditure plan to the CDE by October 29, 2021 Required to have the below:

- 1. How the LEA will use the minimum of 20% of funds it reserves for learning loss to address the academic impact of lost instructional time
- 2. How the LEA will spend its remaining ESSER III funds
- How the LEA will ensure that the interventions it implements will respond to the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students, and particularly those students disproportionately impacted by the COVID–19 pandemic

LEAs must engage in meaningful consultation with specified stakeholders



Expenditure Plan Highlights

ESSER III Safe In Person Learning

Other funding sources outside of ESSER III were used to address safe in person learning. Items purchased included electro static misters, PPE, HEPA filters, and HVAC MERV-13 filters.



Funds will be used to address site-specific social-emotional (SEL) and academic learning needs directly or indirectly caused by distance and hybrid learning in 2020-21. This is a continuation of action begun in 2021-22. ESSER III funds will be used in 2022-23.	\$500,000
Expanded Learning Opportunities Grant	Hire Coordinator for Expanded Learning Opportunities	Continue to employ for two additional years a district administrator responsible for planning and oversight of Expanded Learning Opportunities and related projects. Continuation of action begun in 2021-22. ESSER III funds will be used in 2022-24.	\$440,000

	Indirect costs (administrative)	Indirect costs represent the expenses of doing business that are not readily identified with a particular grant, contract, project function or activity, but are necessary for the general operation of the organization and the conduct of activities it performs. In theory, costs like heat, light, accounting and personnel might be charged directly if little meters could record minutes in a cross-cutting manner. Practical difficulties preclude such an approach. Therefore, cost allocation plans or indirect cost rates are used to distribute those costs to benefiting revenue sources.	\$82,239
