
Strategic Plan 2027 Goal Area 5

Budget Process


Budget Adoption Process





2022-23 Governor's Budget May Revise Highlights

LCFF and Basic Aid District



- Many districts in the State will see their funding levels increase. MVWSD will not see the same increase.
- State programs make up about 7% of our budget

2022-23 State Budget Proposals Governor's May Revision Highlights

- 6.56% increase on State funding only
- Potential One-Time Discretionary Block Grant Funding
- Changes to the Extended Learning
 Opportunities (ELOP) Funding
- Additional Funding for Universal Meals
- Additional Funding for Deferred Maintenance
- Electric Bus Grant Funding

2022-23 State Budget Proposal 6.56% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA)

- On our State programs only:
 - After School Education and Safety (ASES)
 - Special Education
 - Child Nutrition Meal Reimbursements
 - State Preschool Reimbursements
 - Mandate Block Grant

2022-23 State Budget Proposal One-Time Discretionary Block Grant

Potentially could be up to \$1,500 per student

 Intent for uses: address student learning challenges, protect staffing levels, and support the mental health and wellness of staff and students

2022-23 State Budget Proposal Extended Learning Opportunities - Program (ELO-P)

- Increased in the funding for per eligible student
- LEA's with UPP less than 75% must offer and provide access to all unduplicated students in TK-6
- Must provide transportation if not offering at all sites

2022-23 State Budget Proposal Universal Meals

- Beginning 2022-23, all LEAs are required to provide two free meals per day to any student who requests a meal.
- The higher Federal reimbursement rates will end June 30, 2022
- Governor's proposal is to backfill the Federal portion to fund the program.

2022-23 State Budget Proposal Deferred Maintenance Funding

- One-Time Funding
- Major repair or replacement of building systems
- Painting of school buildings
- Any other significant maintenance items
- Must create a "2022-23 Deferred Maintenance Fund"
- Must hold a public meeting for plan uses of the money

2022-23 State Budget Proposal Green Bus Grants

• \$1.5 B initiative for Green Buses

Grants up to \$500,000 per district depending on eligibility

Will include infrastructure, i.e. bus charging stations



Next Steps

2022-2023 Budget Adoption Next Steps

- State budget negotiations are happening now with the Governor, Assembly and State Senate
- Legislative Budget Due June 15
- Governor Signs Budget July 1
- District may update Budget with a 45 Day Revision if there are Significant Changes in Budget Bill
