For the upcoming school year of 22-23, Safe Route School program will provide transportation safety training, host encouragement and engagement events and evaluate this program’s effectiveness. The activities are planned throughout the year for all different grade levels. Table 1 provides a description and other relevant details of the activities.

Safety Training	All public schools (all grades except PreK and Kinder)	This all-day training will include a helmet fitting demonstration, bicycle safety and maintenance demonstration, crosswalk demonstration, and a suggested route to school map overview. Students will be divided into 4 groups (10 students max per group) and will rotate through the different stations.
