Purpose of Study Session

Discuss concept and provide feedback regarding amending the Joint Powers Agreement with the Mountain View Whisman Elementary and Mountain View-Los Altos Union High School Districts



Educational Enhancement Reserve JPA

- Established 2006; \$400,000 per year to MV-Whisman Elementary and MV-LA Union High School Districts
- Adjusted annually; currently \$464,000
- \$5.2 million total paid to School Districts since 2006
- "enhancement of educational and technology capacity of students who, in turn, will contribute to local technology workforce"

Educational Enhancement Reserve JPA

- Why revisit now?
 - 5 years of experience under current JPA
 - Significant financial constraints on schools:
 - MV Whisman change to basic-aid district
 - Stagnant property tax revenues
 - State budget impacts



- Continue positive collaborations with School Districts, recognizing strong schools are important for Mountain View to be a desirable place to live and work
- Continue to provide for the immediate and long-term needs of the Shoreline Community
- Avoid negative impacts to city-wide services

Potential JPA Amendment Options

- Option 1:
 - Enhanced formula
 - Grows with Assessed Value growth of Shoreline Community
 - Potentially sustainable over long-term
 - One-time payments for 3 Years
 - Assistance during difficult economic times
 - Comprehensively assess future needs/liabilities of Shoreline Community
- Option 2:
 - Continue current JPA payments until long-term arrangement is reached
 - Estimated 18-24 month assessment period and review with School Districts
