MVWSD has partnered with security consultant Joffe Emergency Services to seek areas of improvement.

B. Enrollment Update (45 minutes)

Trustee Blakely reported Trustee Chiang left the meeting at 8:38 p.m. for a work commitment.

Staff reported there had been a decline in most non-choice elementary schools. The Middle School enrollment increased this year. MVWSD has seen an increase in McKinney Vento families.

C. CAASPP Assessment Data (45 minutes)

MVWSD students had a 5-point decline in scores but continued to outperform the county and state average for both English Language Arts and Math. MVWSD continues to assess students three times a year with i-Ready and other data points.
