One solution can be that teachers who are assigned more than 2 preps (excluding the advisory) get 2 prep periods. |

We are all very happy to have more instructional minutes for our students and are eager to make this work! I did want to make one more point. When I started teaching in this district 8 years ago, we had a 7 period schedule with one prep. We also did not have co-teaching, nor did we have SIOP, and, at Crittenden, we taught double period math with 7 or 8 math teachers! Next year, we will still have all of these expectations on our shoulders plus a new advisory period with only 5 teachers who teach 10 levels of math, RTI and coding (and WEB). If we decide to move to the 7-period schedule next year, fewer electives will not be enough to mitigate the $50 \%$ cut in planning time along with the increase in expectations over the years. Please keep this in mind when you look at the master schedules. Thank you. |
