The California Dashboard is used by parents/guardians, educators, and other stakeholders to see how local educational agencies and schools perform under California's school accountability system. The Dashboard displays overall performance and student group performance on multiple measures called state and local indicators. All local indicators must be updated annually and reported to the local Governing Board in conjunction with the approval of the Local Control Accountability Plan.
