B. <u>Superintendent Report</u>

Superintendent Baier mentioned:

- MVWSD was recently named a 2025 California Green Ribbon School District Sustainability Honoree for the second consecutive year.
- Graham Middle School's first-ever Leadership Mountain View Career Day was organized with the Leadership Mountain View Class of 2025. Eighth graders heard from professionals across diverse fields.
- New tenant incentive, offering two months of free rent to new tenants for eligible applicants who have submitted applications on or after April 4, 2025
- A U.S. Coast Guard helicopter will land on the Stevenson/Theuerkauf field as part of a special community engagement event for Día del Niño (Children's Day) at Theuerkauf.
- MVWSD received a staff housing Certificate of Occupancy after a successful State and City inspection.

X. REVIEW AND ACTION

A. (Discussion) Update on MVWSD+ Expanded Learning Programs

Staff shared an update on MVWSD+, the district's afterschool and school break program, provided for free to qualifying students. The program is offered at every MVWSD school and helps students succeed academically and socially. Next year, the program will continue collaborating with the YMCA of Silicon Valley and Beyond the Bell (BTB). MVWSD+ serves approximately 1,100 students during the school year and 700 in the summer.

The District must submit a Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators to the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing each year. Submission by the employing agency of a Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators shall be a prerequisite to issuing any emergency permit and/or limited assignment permit for that agency.

The Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators by an employing agency is valid for no more than twelve months. It expires on the 30th day of June following its submission to the Commission.

MVWSD is still looking to hire Language Teachers at the Middle School level.

C. (Action) Resolution No. 02-042425 Recognizing May 14, 2025 as Day of the Teacher

A motion was made by Devon Conley and seconded by Ana Reed to Staff recommend that the Board of Trustees approve and adopt Resolution No. 02-042425 Recognizing May 14, 2025, as Day of the Teacher as presented.

I. (Action) Year End Closing and Board Authority

A motion was made by William Lambert and seconded by Devon Conley to to extend the meeting to 10:30 p.m..

Ayes: Conley, DiFazio, Henry, Lambert, Reed

The district must close its financial books by state reporting timelines and accounting standards.

Three options were presented to the trustees:

- 1. A temporary Resolution that grants limited authority to the Superintendent or Board President to approve and ratify late or unexpected expenses to close the books accurately.
- 2. Defer payment to the next fiscal year, risking the expense to be recorded in the wrong year and possible audit findings.
- 3. A Special Board meeting will be held in July to approve the remaining items.

Trustees Conley, Henry, and Reed agreed with excluding some categories, that a public report should be prepared, ratification should occur at the Board retreat in early August, and the resolution delegating authority to the Superintendent be approved.

Trustee DiFazio agreed with the disclosure and categorization but disagreed with delegating the authority solely to the Superintendent.

Trustee Lambert prefers to hold a Special Meeting and disapproves of delegating authority to the Superintendent.

Staff will return with the trustees' suggestions at a following meeting.

J. (Discussion) First Reading-Board Policies Updates

Trustee DiFazio provided background information from the April 16, 2025, Policy Committee Meeting on CSBA's policy recommendations, acknowledging that policies remain the responsibility of the entire board. In some cases, policy recommendations are not ready, and continued work is needed.

Trustee Conley mentioned not having BP 6144, Controversial Issues. Trustee DiFazio commented that fifteen policies were reviewed during the last Policy Committee Meeting, that the Policy Committee had reviewed BP 6144, and that it would be included in a subsequent batch.

Trustee Reed appreciated the smaller batch of policies being brought to the trustees.

K. (Action) Board Policy 5145.13 Response To Immigration Enforcement

A motion was made by Charles DiFazio and seconded by Ana Reed to Motion.

Ayes: Conley, DiFazio, Henry, Lambert, Reed

Superintendent Baier stated that the Policy Committee did not intend to reduce the obligation to train the MVWSD Staff. The proposed language change from CSBA seemed to move from a passive staff receiving to a more active superintendent or designee providing, and it was suggested that the operative language remain "shall" rather than change to "may."

Trustee Henry commented that the policy was adopted in 2018, out of the attorney general's recommendation; additional guidance from the attorney general was released in December 2024. The CSBA recommended changes was to incorporate the specific changes to the model language from the original attorney general's policy.

Trustee DiFazio mentioned the Board Development Bylaw as one of the policies being updated; in part, it states that a board calendar shall be developed for board development. It would be helpful when refreshing the older policies as they are updated.

L. (Action) Resolution No.07-042425 to Establish Special Reserve Fund for Other than Capital Outlay Projects Fund 170

A motion was made by Ana Reed and seconded by Devon Conley to approve Resolution No.07-042425 to Establish Special Reserve Fund for Other than Capital Outlay Projects Fund 170.

Ayes: Conley, DiFazio, Henry, Lambert, Reed

The resolution would enable the Mountain View Whisman School District to request that the Santa Clara County Auditor and Treasurer establish a restricted fund, known as the Special Reserve-Other Than Capital Outlay Projects Fund 170. Such a fund is authorized to provide for the accumulation of general fund monies for general operating costs, and the School District has accumulated funds for these purposes.

XI. BOARD UPDATES

Board Updates:

- Trustee Reed attended a CSBA finance session and a CTA Board training session. She found that the CTA session's focus differed from CSBA's training. The CTA focused on empowering one as a board member, covering what can and should be done, what questions to ask, and where to find relevant documents, such as the SACS document. The slide deck will be shared with MVWSD's MVEA President.
- Trsutee Conley organized the visit from CSBA President Betty Lusk to tour the County along with the executive officers of the Santa Clara County School Boards Association. They visited Loma Prieta, the San Jose Unified School District, the Baressa School District, and the Hester Cluster, a special education site for high school students.

- Trustee Conley also participated in a meeting with staff at Foothill and members of the Advocacy Committee for Unhoused Students of the Santa Clara County School Board Association, seeking support for the Family Congregate Shelter in Sunnyvale.
- Trustee Conley mentioned attending the Hoffmann Award in May. The California School Board Association awards the Hoffmann Awards.

Trustee DiFazio mentioned that the "Item for Future Agendas" was an informational section where board members could discuss items they would like to see added to the agenda in the future; it's not an official vote.
